
The Dr John Mannam Prize for Dux of Second Year Mechanical Engineering

PRIZE RULES

Establishment

This prize was established in 2012 through a contribution to the University by Dr Kim Boon Lim, in memory of the late Dr John Mannam who was an academic staff member of the School of Mechanical Engineering and Dr Lim's former Lecturer, mentor and friend.

The capital for the prize is held in perpetuity resulting in the minimum annual prize distribution paid from the Endowment Fund¹.

Value

The value of the Prize will be \$500.00 per year, or such other amount as the University shall from time to time determine provided that the value of the prize does not exceed the annual distribution of interest available from the Endowment Fund.

Eligibility

The prize will be awarded annually by the University to eligible 2nd year students enrolled in the Bachelor of Engineering (Honours) (Mechanical) degree program or associated double degrees.

Selection of Candidate

The Head of the School of Mechanical Engineering will award the prize to the student who is enrolled in at least 18 units of second year courses presented towards the degree and achieves the highest weighted average.

If there is no candidate of sufficient merit in a given year then the prize will not be awarded in that year and the money will be used in subsequent years. In this case, provision may be made for multiple prizes in subsequent years.

If there is more than one candidate of equal merit, then the prize shall be shared equally.

Variations

The University may vary the rules from time to time in a manner consistent with the University's legal obligations and [policies](#).
