
The Maptek Prize for Computer Science

PRIZE RULES

Establishment

This non-endowed prize has been established by the University as a result of a contribution by Maptek. An Adelaide headquartered company who develop and sell mining software internationally, Maptek are a highly regarded local employer of graduates in Computer Science, Engineering and Geology.

In support of the prize, Maptek shall provide to the University an annual amount of \$500.00

Value

The value of the prize will be \$500 per year offered annually from 2017, until otherwise determined by the University after discussions with the contributor.

Eligibility

A prize shall be awarded annually by the University to eligible students from any degree across the University who completes at least 12 units of level II Computer Science courses with at least one completed in the year for which the prize is awarded.

Selection of Candidate

The Head of the School of Computer Science (or nominee) will award the prize to the student enrolled in at least 12 units of Level II Computer Science courses who obtains the highest aggregate score of marks.

If there is no candidate of sufficient merit in a given year then the prize will not be awarded in that year and the money will be used in subsequent years.

If there is more than one candidate of equal merit, then the prize shall be shared equally.

Variations

The University may vary the rules from time to time in a manner consistent with the original objectives of the prize.
