### Prize Rules

#### Establishment

This Prize has been established by a donation to the University by the Botanic Gardens of South Australia, in honour of Allan Dale Correy and the contribution he made to the landscape architecture profession in South Australia including preparation of the master plan for the Mount Lofty Botanic Garden

#### Value

The value of the Prize will be \$500.00 per year for 5 years until otherwise determined by the University after discussions with the donor.

\$150 credit to SA Professional Development events.  
Graduate membership to PIA for a year.  
Framed certificate.

#### Eligibility

The prize is awarded by the University annually and on the following eligibility criteria:  
Awarded to the student studying full-time with the highest Grade point average (GPA) for core courses delivered in the second year of the Master of Planning program

#### Selection of Candidate

The School's Learning Committee will award the prize to the student(s) who have achieved the highest aggregate of marks in the following courses:

- Development Studio (ARCH 7045)
- Research Methods (GEOG 5010)
- Planning Theory and Practice (PLANNING 7035)
- Planning Dissertation (GEOG 5505)

If there is more than one candidate of equal merit, then the prize may be shared equally.
