

The Laurence T. Schneider Prize in Art History and Theories Rules

Background

In 1987, Laurence Theodore Schneider, a former student in the program for the degree of Bachelor of Architecture, bequeathed to the University the sum of \$4,000 to establish a history prize in the School of Architecture and Built Environment.

The following Rules now apply:-

1. The Prize shall be known as The Laurence T Schneider Prize in Art History and Theories.
2. The value of the prize shall be \$800 or such other amount as the University shall from time to time determine provided that the value of the Prize does not exceed the annual distribution of interest available from the Endowment Fund.
3. The Prize shall be awarded annually to the student who achieves the highest marks the course History Theory 2 (DESST 2521) in the Bachelor of Architectural Design program.
4. Where two or more candidates are of equal merit, the Prize shall be shared equally.
5. If there is no candidate of sufficient merit in any given year then the Prize will not be awarded in that year and the available distribution of interest will be added to the capital sum in the Endowment Fund.
6. The University may vary the rules from time to time in a manner consistent with the University's legal obligations and policies.
